## HOW TO BE A PILLAR IN YOUR GROUP.

1 Peter 4:11 says, If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen (NIV).

St. Peter is often called a pillar of the church. He gives us some great advice in the previous passage to help us define how we, too, can be pillars. A pillar is an object used to support a structure. In organizations such as the LWML, "pillars" are members who are prominent supporters that set an example for the others in their group to follow. Strong groups need strong members. Here are some ways you can help build up your LWML and support the work God has given them to do:

Be in the Word. God's Word is our strength. Servants need to be nourished by the Word in order to be strong. Being in the Word as a group and as an individual will strengthen your bond as sisters in Christ.

Connect. Find ways to connect personally with others. Ask questions and

identify common areas of interest. Do something outrageously kind for a sister in Christ with no expectation of anything in return. Your positive, genuine efforts will have a lasting impact.

Pray. Praying is a bit like blogging. With blogging we pour

We then hope someone will read the entry, and may even look to see if anyone has offered advice. With prayer, we don't need to wonder if anyone is listening; we know God always hears us, and He offers us direction and guidance in His Word to inspire us with ways to address our

problems. He of course delights when we share our joys with Him!

Collaborate. Your sisters in Christ are an excellent support system. Ask for their opinions and listen to what they have to say. Incorporate their input into your decision making. Work on inclusion and resist exclusion.

Put yourself out there. Go out of your way to greet a sister you haven't talked to in a while. Never ignore someone because you think she ignored you first; she probably never even noticed you were there because she was trying to decide whether the oven had been left turned on or not. And that's the way it starts – once you begin to do it, others try it too, because they see it's safe and enjoyable.

Do the right thing because it's the right thing to do. Demonstrate integrity and stand up to unethical comments or decisions. Often all it takes is one brave soul to ask a sensible question, "Do we all really believe that this is the right thing to do ... that this is what God would have us do?" Then more people will feel strong enough to say that they, too, don't agree. That one brave soul can be anyone. With God's help, it can be you.

Dear Friend's of LA-MS District LWML,

Thank you for your generous donation of Quilts and Kits for LWR's distribution overseas. These gifts of your hearts and hands are beautiful expressions of God's grace and love to people all around the world.

As the civil war in Syria continues, the number of civilian casualties, internally displace people and refugees also continues to grow. Millions of people have been displaced from their homes. Without work for many months, parents of displaced Syrian children lack any source of income to purchase school or basic hygiene materials for their children. Because of your support, LWR has been able to respond to this crisis, by shipping Mission Quilts, Baby Care Kits and Personal Care Kits to Serbia to distribute to refugees and migrants. In helping meet the basic needs of displaced youth, you are helping children to succeed in their academic and personal pursuits while alleviating some of the financial burden on displace families.

Your quilts and kits both provide important necessities during this crisis and remind our Syrian neighbors that they are not alone or forgotten. In the first part of 2016, we have also shipped quilts and kits to India, Peru, Honduras, Georgia and Uganda to distribute to people in need. Dear Members of The LWML,

We are deeply grateful for your donation of 559 pounds of food items to familiesin-need during the month of April, 2016.

Because of your help, and that of many others, during April we served 299 families consisting of 263 children, 434 adults and 24 elderly (a total of 721 individuals) by distributing 42,714 pounds of food and supplies which should last about three weeks; this allows our clients time to apply for Food Stamps, or as a supplement to food stamp allotments.

Our ministry is made possible through the generosity of people, churches, schools, businesses, social and civic organizations of Houma/Terrebonne, the United Way, Second Harvest and Feeding America and the work of our Volunteers who donated 487 hours of their time during the month.

Thank you for all that you do for the less fortunate of our Houma/Terrebonne Community.

### 2017 Albuquerque Convention Banner Guidelines

Banner specifications are noted below.

- 1. Finished banner size is to be 3' X 5'. Added fringe may be longer.
- 2. You may **not** use the convention logo on your banner, but do base your design on the convention theme, "Jesus Christ Above All." You may use the convention colors (note the letterhead) or other colors if you wish. *Heavy fabric or bulky items are discouraged*, as your banner should be relatively easy to manage when carried.
- 3. Your district's name **must** be on the front of the banner, though it may be abbreviated. Use any size letters you wish. *Place a small identifying tag naming your district on the lower left corner on the backside of the banner*, to help identify your district banner when rolled up.
- 4. Attach two ties to the back of the banner. One of the ties is to be at the center of the banner width, about 10–12" from the top. The second tie is to be at the center of the banner width about 10–12" from the bottom. These ties should be long enough to tie a bow around a 2" pole, and are necessary to help hold the banner to the pole. Note: Do not use Velcro to hold banner to pole, as it has proved to be ineffective. Please use ties as described.
- 5. Dowels used at the bottom of banners must be tacked in place to prevent them from slipping out of the casing.
- 6. Attach the banner to a 1" dowel with a screw eye on each end of the dowel. **Please use a strong quarter-inch or 8 mm cord**. Make a small loop at the center for hanging. Secure the cording through each eye screw, laying the cord flat along the dowel, with the small loop at the center of the banner. Knot the cord on the outside of each screw. Be sure to attach the cord tightly because it will stretch when the banner is hung. We encourage you to hang your banner before sending it to the convention, to allow time for stretching.
- 7. The Host Committee will provide poles and stands for the banner.
