“Celebrate the Lord of the Nations”

Greetings in the name of the LORD! I pray that all is well with you, with your families, with your congregations, with your LWML societies, with your LWML zones, and with the LA-MS LWML District. “May mercy, peace, and love be multiplied to you.” (Jude 1:2) As you know, our theme for this biennium is drawn from Psalm 33, verses twelve and thirteen, which read:

¹² Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD, the people whom he has chosen as his heritage! ¹³ The LORD looks down from heaven; he sees all the children of man; (Psalm 33:12-13, ESV)

When we read the word, “LORD”, in the ESV translation, we should also have in mind that this is the personal name of God, “YHWH”, typically pronounced Yahweh, that he revealed to Moses at the burning bush in Exodus 3:14-15. As such, this is the name of the one true God, the triune God – The Father, Son & Holy Spirit. So, with that in mind, we could rewrite of our theme verses as:

¹² Blessed is the nation whose God is [YHWH], the people whom he has chosen as his heritage! ¹³ [YHWH] looks down from heaven; he sees all the children of man; (Psalm 33:12-13)

OR

¹² Blessed is the nation whose God is [the one true God, the triune God - the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit], the people whom he has chosen as his heritage! ¹³ [The one true God, the triune God - the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit] looks down from heaven; he sees all the children of man; (Psalm 33:12-13)

In our last newsletter, I focused on the work of God the Son. In this newsletter, I will focus on the work of the Third Person of the Holy Trinity, God the Holy Spirit.

*¹² Blessed is the nation whose God is the [one true God, the triune **God – the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit**], the people whom he has chosen as his heritage!¹³ The LORD [one true God, the triune **God – the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit**] looks down from heaven; he sees all the children of man; (Psalm 33:12-13)*

When it comes to the work of God the Holy Spirit as it is identified in the Third Article of the Creed, “I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.”, we were taught in Dr. Luther’s Small Catechism to believe and confess the following:

I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.

In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.

In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers.

On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.

This is most certainly true.

“Blessed is the nation”, blessed are you, whose God is YHWH, the triune God. Blessed are you because the God the Holy Spirit took you who were once spiritually blind (1 Cor. 12:4) and gave you eyes to see your Savior, Christ Jesus. Blessed are you because the God the Holy Spirit took you who were once dead in your sins and trespasses (Eph. 2:1) and gave you life in Christ Jesus through the waters of Holy Baptism (Titus 3:5-7). Blessed are you because God the Holy Spirit took you who were once an unbeliever, separated from God and gave you faith that trust in Christ Jesus through the hearing of the Gospel (Rom. 10:17). Blessed are you because the God the Holy Spirit has enabled you to confess that Jesus is Lord (1 Cor. 12:3), so that you will be saved and never be put to shame (Rom. 10:10-13)

“Blessed is the nation”, blessed are you, whose God is YHWH, the triune God. Blessed are you because the God the Holy Spirit continues to be at work in you through God’s Word and Sacraments to keep you in the true faith that leads to life everlasting. Blessed are you because God the Holy Spirit continues to seek out the sheep who continually wander from the fold of Jesus Christ and bring them back to their Good Shepherd and restore them into a right relationship with the Triune God (LSB 612, cf Luke 15). Blessed are you because the God the Holy Spirit continues to lead you to repentance and turns you around and brings you back to receive that forgiveness that Jesus has won for us and freely pours out upon us for the sake of

Christ Jesus. This is why we continue to celebrate the LORD of the nations in our individual lives and collectively each and every day. (LSB 806) And this is why we continue to joyfully proclaim Christ in the world around us, and support missions at home and abroad, because we know that God “would not see the sinner dead, I want him turned from error’s ways, Repentant, living endless days.” (LSB 614, *cf* Ez. 33:1-20)

“Blessed is the nation”, blessed are you, whose God is YHWH, the triune God. Blessed are you because the God the Holy Spirit “will rescue me from every evil deed and bring me safely into His heavenly kingdom” (2 Tim 4:18a) as St. Paul says, “But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like His glorious body, by the power that enables Him even to subdue all things to Himself” (Phlp. 3:20-21) Or as we sing in the suggested Hymn of the Day for Pentecost Sunday (LSB 497):

Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord,
With all Your graces now outpoured
On each believer’s mind and heart
Your fervent love impart.
Lord, by the brightness of Your light
In holy faith Your Church unite;
From ev’ry land and ev’ry tongue
This to Your praise, O Lord, our God be sung: Alleluia, Alleluia!

Come, holy Light, guide divine,
Now cause the Word of life to shine.
Teach us to know our God aright
And call Him Father with delight.
From ev’ry error keep us free;
Let none but Christ our master be
That we in living faith abide,
In Him, our Lord, with all our might confide. Alleluia, Alleluia!

Come, holy Fire, comfort true,
Grant us the will Your work to do
And in Your service to abide;
Let trials turn us not aside.
Lord, by Your pow’r prepare each heart,
And to our weakness strength impart
That bravely here we may contend,
Through life and death to You, our Lord, ascend. Alleluia, Alleluia!

May the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of all mercies and God all comfort be with you now and always.

The first four offices serve four-year terms, and the nominating committee serves a two-year term. To nominate a woman (who has previously held or currently holds any office at the zone level) for any of the listed district offices, please complete the LA-MS District Recommendation found on the web site and submit it to the Nominating Committee Chairman (include your name, mailing address, and email address). Permission from the person to submit her name is not needed as the committee will determine which are qualified nominees.

The Nominating Committee should have at least three members to be elected from a slate of at least five representing a minimum of three zones.

To nominate a pastor for Junior Pastoral Counselor, please provide his name to a LA-MS district board member on the nominating committee. As per the LWML LA-MS Bylaws, the Board of Directors shall select six nominees, if possible, for Pastoral Counselors at the fall board meeting in odd numbered years. The Nominating Committee shall submit the names of the nominees to the LCMS Southern District President for approval. From the list of approved nominees, the Nominating Committee shall select two and obtain their written consent to serve if elected. Send it to Nominating Committee Chairman, Laretta Houston at ladhouston49@gmail.com or you may send it via postal mail to Laretta Houston, PO Box 1644, Rosepine, LA 70659.

Please consider yourself, a sister, and a pastor for nominations. As my LWML mentor, Liz Hilliard, advised, “Don’t be quick to say ‘no’. Pray first and consider the calling.” If you have held an office at the zone level and have never served at the district level, perhaps it is time for you to serve in a different position. You will not be alone. You have support from many ladies. We are all members of one body and serve the Lord with gladness. The only question is HOW will you serve?

Hello to all of the ladies of the LWML LA-MS District. I am Laura Lips, the proud and blessed President of the Southern Zone. I am pleased to combine this summary of our societies' activities and how they have been able to ***“Serve the Lord with Gladness”*** since our last *Mission Voice* submission.



The ***Cross of Calvary University-Baton Rouge*** society president, Kathy Abbott, stated that they met in January to sort and pack food items for the LSU and Southern Food Pantries, and they continue to collect food items for these campuses throughout the year. They also hosted and provided snacks for the January Southern Zone Spring Executive Board Meeting.

In February, she and Harriett Bridges were able to attend the “Phil’s Friends” workshop held at Trinity. They enjoyed participating with all of the ladies and making cards and hats. The main focus of their service is providing for the students

who attend both LSU and Southern University, following His command “... ***Jesus called his disciples to him and said, “I have compassion on the crowd because they have been with me now three days and have nothing to eat. And I am unwilling to send them away hungry, lest they faint on the way.”***”

The ***Holy Trinity-Covington/New Life-Folsom*** society president, Rhonda Jackson, excitedly shared that they had a truly enjoyable Christmas luncheon, with an ornament exchange, at a local restaurant. They have also been working on several ongoing projects, including sewing and decorating bereavement pillows for parents who have lost a newborn. I feel that if you have ever lost a child (no matter their age), you can surely relate to the huge hole that this loss leaves in one’s heart and life, and that one of these pillows would be so comforting to you on many occasions. They also continue to knit and crochet prayer shawls for their Prayer Shawl Ministry; and also have a project “in the works” making “goody” bags for infusion patients at a local cancer center. They are truly living out the words of ***Psalm 147:3, He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.***

The ***St. Paul-Hammond*** society president, Gail Gerike, shared that she attended the Zone Executive Board Meeting held at Cross of Calvary University on 1/5, where plans were made for the Spring Rally, to be held at Redeemer on 3/22, using the theme ***“Trusting in the Lord”*** and the Bible verse *Matthew 6:34, Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.*”

In February, the annual Southern Zone LWML Prayer Service was held at St. Paul and officiated by Pastor Louis Boldt. The LWML prayer service was titled ***“Blessed Are They...”***, using the Beatitudes from *Matthew 5:1-12*; and was live-streamed via YouTube. The ***Trinity-Baton Rouge*** society president, Liz Slothower, shared news about their annual *“Veteran’s Honor, Soup-to-Go & Bake Sale.”* The proceeds were divided to support both the National and District mite grants and contribute towards the congregation’s youth being able to attend the *National Youth Gathering* in New Orleans this summer. In December, they caringly collected jackets and toys for children in North Carolina who, along with their families, were greatly affected by Hurricane Helene in late September. In February, they had a good time hosting a “Phil’s Friends” servant event and working on projects for the men, women, and children cancer victims they serve. She then shared (*shush!*) that they are currently planning a *“spring garden party luncheon”* and will bless the

preschool families and staff with gifts.
