GEAUX PURPLE AND GOLD!

The Lod Cook Hotel and Alumni Conference Center will be our meeting site for the LA-MS District LWML Convention April 22-24, 2022. This is in Baton Rouge, Louisiana at the edge of the Louisiana State University (LSU) campus overlooking University Lake, just a short walk from Chapel of the Cross Lutheran Church.

The hotel features complimentary parking, wired and wireless internet, HDTV, a fitness center, two continental breakfasts per room, and the LSU alumni gift shop. Two additional breakfasts will need to be purchased if four people are staying in a room. 65 rooms have been blocked so you will want to reserve yours soon. Be sure to mention you are attending the LA-MS LWML convention when making your reservation.

The Cook Hotel raises money from every guest that stays at the hotel and puts it toward student scholarships and professorships at LSU. Another fun fact is that the football and basketball teams stay at the hotel every home game. LSU's mascot is Mike the Tiger and the school colors are purple and gold. Did you know purple and gold are the official colors of LWML also? Purple symbolizes royalty and gold symbolizes value and integrity. Be sure to pack plenty of LWML purple and gold to sport while on campus!

Next door to the Hotel and Conference Center is the LSU Recreation Center, known as the UREC. Amenities include indoor and outdoor pools, a lazy river, a 35' rock climbing wall, an indoor track, basketball and tennis courts, badminton, volleyball, arcade games and even a Smoothie King on site. An ID is required to purchase a guest pass \$10 per day by persons 18 years and older. Passes are also available for children accompanied by their parent.

LWML LA-MS DISTRICT CONVENTION 2022

The LWML LA-MS District Department of Special Focus Ministries has chosen two Gifts from the Heart giving opportunities to be received at the District Convention on April 22, 2022.

The first is giving food items to the LSU Food Pantry Drive, sponsored by Chapel of the Cross Lutheran Church LWML, Baton Rouge. During December 2018 and January 2019, members of Chapel of the Cross Lutheran Church, located on the campus of LSU in Baton Rouge, collected food items to be donated to the **LSU Food Pantry**. Let's continue this tradition!

The mission of the pantry is to provide students in need who may experience hunger or food insecurity. The pantry exists to address the issue of situational hunger, and Chapel's LWML members are committed to make this food donation an ongoing effort.

Another opportunity for giving is gift cards to be used for groceries and other supplies to <u>Forged by Fire</u>. This is a disaster relief team that works with The Village Lutheran Church Feeding Ministry in Lacombe, Louisiana. Under the direction of Rev. Paul Ernewein, volunteers serve 800-1200 freshly prepared meals throughout areas affected by disasters. Gift cards from stores such as Walmart, Sam's Club, and Costco may be given for the team to use as they need. Please denote amount on each gift card.

MISSION GRANT UPDATE

Greetings brothers and sisters in Christ,

I hope that all of you had a joyous Christmas season and praying for a Happy New Year with God 's will in 2022.

LWML LA-MS District's next mission grant to be funded for \$5000.00 is Mission Grant #7. It is for the steeple replacement and repair at Epiphany Lutheran Church of New Orleans. This church was built in 1915 and survived hurricanes Betsy and Katrina.

Our last grant is for \$500.00. It is to feed lunch to the Lutheran School students in Haiti. The HOPE project provides a powerful witness of Christ's love along with the food that for many is their only meal for the day. See their letter on the next page.

Mission Grant #4 of \$5000.00, "Reaching the Homeless in District D of New Orleans," was deferred earlier in 2021. After their congregation was severely affected by the COVID pandemic, the Ladies Aid Society of St. Paul Lutheran, New Orleans (Annette Street) was forced to step down from providing hot meals in their church's Fellowship Hall to the homeless in their community. The church also was damaged in Hurricane Ida. Thankfully, recent circumstances have enabled the ladies to enthusiastically resume reaching out to the homeless with hot meals.

We only have two more months to collect mites for this biennium. Please get your mites into the district with diligence so that these wonderful grants can be paid.
